Breakfast - La Herencia Café

Dine in this small Cuban-American restaurant serving family recipes and breakfast all day. The café is located on Aviles Street, the oldest street in the city, and now one of the area's most diverse arts districts. The charming bricked street is lined with art galleries and restaurants.

Explore 450 Years of Architecture

On the Homes & Buildings of St. Augustine tour, take a stroll through the city's past as you view the architecture of the oldest city in the United States. The 2-hour architectural journey begins with the Spanish Colonial Period and continues with the British Colonial Period, Victorian Period, Flagler Era, early 20th century, Boom Era, Depression Era and into modern times.

Dine in the former indoor pool of Henry Flagler's Alcazar Hotel, once the largest of its kind. Occasionally drained to house elaborate gardens, this pool is now an elegant eatery featuring local and organic ingredients.

Tour the Lightner Museum

Built in the Spanish Renaissance Revival style in 1887, this museum is now a monument to the lavishness of the Gilded Age. Featuring three floors of artifacts from the 19th and 20th centuries, including Victorian clothing and art, stained Tiffany glass, and paintings and oddities from around the world.

Ximenez-Fatio House Museum

Walk from Flagler College to a guided tour of the coquina Ximenez-Fatio House. Built as a merchant's home in 1798, the house later became "Miss Fatio's," a fashionable woman-owned boarding house. Today, the house museum has been restored to reflect its role during Florida's first tourism boom in the 1800s.

Fine Spanish dining featuring innovative twists on heritage classics, live entertainment and world-class wine pairings. Located in the heart of Historic Downtown St. Augustine, the building began as the Buchanti House that dates back to 1764, and was made famous by the Whitney Family of Marineland, who refurbished the historic home for the city's 400th anniversary.
